


Play in the Park Summer 2023



Youth Unity CIC's partnership-oriented approach is in sync with the Government's strategy, working diligently to reduce vulnerability and protect local communities through collaborative efforts with a wide array of stakeholders.



The Project Overview

Youth Unity CIC were commissioned to provide a series of sporting and family events in the summer of 2023 across Epping Forest District Council. The activities provided to the community consisted a range of Sports such as Football, Basketball, Table tennis, arts and craft podcasting and music producing.

Youth Unity set clear objectives for the Summer Program in the following areas:

Active Lifestyle: Sporting events delivered to encourage physical activity and promote a healthy lifestyle.

Community cohesion and integration opportunities: The family events during the summer provided a great chance for families to come together and bond. From picnics in the park to sports and creative positive activities creating lasting memories and strengthen family connections.

Community Engagement: The provision of sporting events often bring communities together. With the aim to foster a sense of community spirit and unity, allowing people to connect

Skill Development: The summer sports events offer opportunities for individuals of all ages to improve their skills. From young people learning new sports to adults honing their abilities, these events provided a platform for personal growth and development.

Social Interaction: Providing a chance for the local Epping Forest community to meet new people, make friends, and expand our social networks, enhancing our overall well-being.

Limes Farm 25th July

This particular day proved to be unexpectedly chaotic for us. Upon our initial arrival, we were quite surprised to see more than 30 children waiting for our program.

We hadn't anticipated such a significant turnout, and this unexpected surge of attendees presented us with several challenges, particularly from a safeguarding perspective. It was evident that allowing young people onto the bus with only one person supervising wasn't a safe option. Additionally, some parents were leaving their children with us to supervise, but we had to explain that their presence was necessary for their child's participation.

Furthermore, the bus's location near the community center brought about its own set of challenges.

The barriers around the green and park area made it difficult to ensure safe access. With only two staff members available, it became clear that managing both areas securely and effectively was simply not feasible.

Despite these hurdles, we made the best of the situation. The young people joined us on the bus and engaged in computer games, while parents had the opportunity to sit and chat with us throughout the afternoon.

Limes Farm 15th August

Anticipating a busy session, we took proactive steps to ensure we had a sufficient number of staff available.

The event turned out to be a resounding success, with a strong showing of community members eager to participate. The feedback we received was overwhelmingly positive. With the assistance of local residents, we were able to park the bus on the green, facilitating a seamless setup.

The day was filled with activities like badminton, balloon decorations, and music, creating a palpable sense of community cohesion and togetherness.



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Chigwell Row – 8th August

Unfortunately, this event was poorly attended due to torrential rain. Despite our best efforts, we remained on-site until 3:30 PM, but regrettably, no one was able to join us due to the inclement weather.

Chigwell Row – 29th August

This marked our final event of the summer, and we were fortunate to have some residents from Limes Farm who came out to show their support. However, this location posed some unique challenges. Unfortunately, there was no access for our bus to get onto the park, making the setup more challenging.

We also observed that most local residents primarily frequented the park for activities like tennis or basketball, and the children's play area, which would have been an ideal setup location, was not feasible due to parking restrictions. Despite these hurdles, we appreciated the support from those who did attend the event.



Over the six sessions we engaged with over 80 young people from a range of ages and backgrounds.


How do you define your ethnicity?


